DWSRF Project Status:

To: Board of Commissioners

From: William Neal, General Manager The DWSRF loan has been suspended by the Washington State Department of Commerce. Work on the Wiegardt Wellfield and South Wellfield Treatment Plant are complete. One of the well meters did not pass a start-up test for accuracy. The contractor is working with the manufacture to repair or replace the meter.

Wiegardt Wellfield Generator:

No progress to report in December.

North Wellfield Treatment Plant:

No progress to report in December.

Loomis Lake Crossing Project:

No progress to report in December.

Well #7 Replacement Project:

Gray and Osborne is working on the submittal package for new source approval. When complete it will be submitted to the Department of Health for review and approval.

Meeting with Representative Blake:

Representative Brian Blake visited North Beach Water District in December. During his visit we discussed the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund loans that were suspended in July for project under construction. We also gave Representative Blake a tour of our facilities at the North Wellfield, the South Wellfield, and the Wiegert Wellfield. During our meeting I expressed my concerns about completing our DWSRF project and the added overall cost the suspension of work is going to cost the District. I explained how our contractor may decide the District has defaulted on our construction contract and decide to terminate the contract. Representative Blake was very sympathetic regarding the situation and agreed that the

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passage of a capital budget was the highest priority for the governor and the legislature in this year's short session. We did discuss the possibility of introducing a bill that would refund the DWSRF loans independent of the capital improvement budget. Brian indicated he would support such a bill provided, it was not an omnibus bill.

Since that meeting I contacted Connie Rivera with the Department of Commerce. Connie sent me a copy of the Governor's proposed Capital Improvement bill. The Governor's bill would not only fund suspended DWSRF project but also provide refunds for District that have had expenses since July 1, 2017.

Conversations with Brian Blake, Dean Takko, Connie Rivera, and WAWSD lobbyist Joe Daniels indicate the legislature and the governor are committed to refunding DWSRF loans that have been suspended and reimbursing municipalities that have had out of pocket expenses for their DWSRF projects since July 2017. I am just as confident municipalities who suffer added cost due the states suspension of their DWSRF loans will not receive any consideration for those added costs.
